S. Secretary of State under three presidents. Along with James G. Blaine, he is one of only two people who have served as Secretary of State under three presidents. He also sought the Whig Party nomination for President three times: Born in Salisbury, New Hampshire, Webster was one of the highest-regarded courtroom lawyers of the era and shaped several key U. S. Supreme Court cases that established important constitutional precedents that bolstered the authority of the federal government. As a diplomat he is best known for negotiating the Webster–Ashburton Treaty of 1842 with Great Britain; it established the definitive eastern border between the United States and Canada. Webster entered politics during the era of the Second Party System, which was the political system in the United States from about 1828 to 1854, characterized by rapidly increasing voter interest and personal loyalty to parties. Webster was the outstanding spokesman for American nationalism with powerful oratory that made him a key Whig leader. He spoke for conservatives and led the opposition to Democrat Andrew Jackson and his Democratic Party. He was a spokesman for modernization, banking, and industry, but not for the common people who composed the base of his opponents in Jacksonian Democracy. Calhoun from the South South Carolina. They both worked for compromises to stave off the sectionalism that threatened war between the North and the South. In 1850, a Senate committee selected Webster as one of the five greatest U. S. statesmen. Benjamin Franklin Tefft was an American Methodist minister, author, newspaper editor, and diplomat. This eventually resulted, for example, in the founding of the northern Maine immigrant community of New Sweden and its satellite Stockholm, Maine. In 1852, and again in 1854, he served as a Methodist pastor in Bangor, Maine, and later briefly in Portland. Tefft was appointed U. S. Consul in Stockholm in 1856 and Acting U. S. Minister to Sweden in 1857. Consul in Gothenburg, Sweden, William W. Following the war Thomas would head a Maine immigration bureau and personally oversee the founding of the community of New Sweden. In the eyes of Tefft, Thomas, and the Maine politicians who voted subsidies to settle them, Swedish immigrants were a potential demographic buffer against the Catholic Irish and Francophone populations of Maine at a time when English and American immigration to the state had stopped. Tefft also served as immigration agent while still U. S. Consul for Lake Superior copper mining companies who also desired Scandinavian settlers. Tefft eventually took over the Stockholm consulate as Tefft devoted increasing energy to private interests related to immigration. Tefft had returned to Bangor, Maine by 1858, where he edited the newspaper The Northern Border and continued a literary career that had begun in 1830 with the book Prison Life, and continued with Hungary and Kossuth in 1851 and Webster and his Masterpieces a biography of Daniel Webster in 1852. A CD-ROM version of the complete text, with thousands of additional new words and definitions from the "addenda", was published by Merriam-Webster in , and is often packaged with the print edition. Planning for a Fourth edition of the Unabridged began with a memo from Merriam-Webster president William Llewellyn, but was repeatedly deferred in favour of updates to the more lucrative Collegiate. Work on a full revision finally began in In January the Third New International website service was rebranded as the Unabridged with the first "Release" of 4, new and revised entries added to the site. There were two further "Releases" in The revised website is not branded as the "Fourth edition" and it is unlikely that a print version will ever be produced, because demand is declining and its increased size would make it unwieldy and expensive. Some proper names were returned to the word list, including names of Knights of the Round Table. The most notable change was the inclusion of the date of the first known citation of each word, to document its entry into the English language. The eleventh edition published in includes more than , definitions, and more than , entries. This dictionary is preferred as a source "for general matters of spelling" by the influential The Chicago Manual of Style , which is followed by many book publishers and magazines in the United States. The Chicago Manual states that it "normally opts for" the first spelling listed.
