Not all components need be abstracted, though a dominance of abstraction must exist. Assemblage A three-dimensional Abstract Creative Design, consisting of a combination of "found," disparate objects and plant material. They may be painted, but should remain recognizable and not contrived. Though objects are considered non-art and previously unrelated, the designer creatively relates them through their compatible elemental qualities of line, form, color and texture. In order to be disparate from one another and satisfy the term "assemblage," objects must dominate and there should be three or more different objects.
