I opened a picture book, held out a small piece of candy, and pointed to the first word and image. At ten minutes, he was screaming in fury, a temper tantrum times ten. It was the first time in a year that I knew my son could learn. Such a small thing, but until that point, neither my wife nor I knew whether he was capable of that. Nicholas is also known for coming to the defense of the falsely accused, often preventing them from being executed. He is also known for his intercession on behalf of sailors and other travelers. The popular veneration of Nicholas as a saint seems to have started relatively early. Whereas the importance of relics, and the business associated with pilgrims and patron saints, caused the remains of most saints to be spread over several churches in several countries, St Nicholas is unique in that most of his bones have been preserved in one spot: In the summer of , the report of his remains measurements was sent to a forensic laboratory in England. Today, Saint Nicholas is still celebrated as a great gift-giver in several Western European countries. According to one source, medieval nuns used the night of December 6th to anonymously deposit baskets of food and clothes at the doorsteps of the needy. According to another source, on December 6th every sailor or ex-sailor of the Low Countries which at that time was virtually all of the male population would descend to the harbour towns to participate in a church celebration for their patron saint. A Saint for a Season Saint Nicholas Day is a festival for children in much of Europe related to surviving legends of the saint, and particularly his reputation as a bringer of gifts. Some elements of this part of the Saint Nicholas tradition can be traced back to the Germanic god Wodan Odin. The appearance is similar to some portrayals of this god. Jun 14, at 1: Nicholas Bukoski, of Crofton, Maryland, was indicted on several federal charges in April while already behind bars on state charges. Bukoski is accused in separate cases of an armed robbery at a convenience store and of an arson spree in Anne Arundel County, according to court records. Nick Bukoski has been in jail without bail since April on the Maryland state charges and could face decades in prison if convicted of those crimes. He could also face several years in federal prison on the threat charges. The case against Bukoski was unsealed on June 8 after Bukoski made his first federal court appearance. He was processed and returned to the Anne Arundel County jail. The federal charges were first made public by Politico. The defendant is unemployed and spends most of the day watching Fox News or on the internet. Nicholas Bukoski was indicted on five felony charges on April 11, including two counts of threatening to murder a member of Congress and three counts of transmitting threats in interstate commerce. Nicholas begged the man to not tell anyone what he had done, because he did not want to bring attention to himself. But soon the news got out and when anyone received a secret gift, it was thought that maybe it was from Nicholas. Because of his kindness Nicholas was made a Saint. Nicholas is not only the saint of children but also of sailors! One story tells of him helping some sailors that were caught in a dreadful storm off the coast of Turkey. The storm was raging around them and all the men were terrified that their ship would sink beneath the giant waves. They prayed to St. Nicholas to help them. Suddenly, he was standing on the deck before them. He ordered the sea to be calm, the storm died away, and they were able to sail their ship safely to port. Nicholas was exiled from Myra and later put in prison during the persecution by the Emperor Diocletian. No one really knows when he died, but it was on 6th December in either or . Saint Nicholas of Myra (traditionally 15 March - 6 December), also known as Nicholas of Bari, was an early Christian bishop of the ancient Greek city of Myra in Asia Minor (modern-day Demre, Turkey) during the time of the Roman Empire.

The larger the dowry, the better the chance that a young woman would find a good husband. Without a dowry, a woman was unlikely to marry. Mysteriously, on three different occasions, a bag of gold appeared in their home-providing the needed dowries. The bags of gold, tossed through an open window, are said to have landed in stockings or shoes left before the fire to dry. This led to the custom of children hanging stockings or putting out shoes, eagerly awaiting gifts from Saint Nicholas. Sometimes the story is told with gold balls instead of bags of gold. That is why three gold balls, sometimes represented as oranges, are one of the symbols for St. Nicholas is a gift-giver. One of the oldest stories showing St. Nicholas as a protector of children takes place long after his death. The townspeople of Myra were celebrating the good saint on the eve of his feast day when a band of Arab pirates from Crete came into the district. They stole treasures from the Church of Saint Nicholas to take away as booty. As they were leaving town, they snatched a young boy, Basilios, to make into a slave. The emir, or ruler, selected Basilios to be his personal cupbearer, as not knowing the language, Basilios would not understand what the king said to those around him. So, for the next year Basilios waited on the king, bringing his wine in a beautiful golden cup. As the next St. Meanwhile, as Basilios was fulfilling his tasks serving the emir, he was suddenly whisked up and away. Nicholas appeared to the terrified boy, blessed him, and set him down at his home back in Myra. This is the first story told of St. Nicholas protecting childrenâ€™ which became his primary role in the West.

There is something puppety about his face. We are in a hotel in Mobile, Alabama, a small town on the Gulf Coast where he and Danny Glover are filming an action movie called *Tokarev*, in which Cage plays a reformed mobster reluctantly returning to his violent roots when his daughter is kidnapped. The day before, they filmed a car chase down the main street and the excitement still ripples through the glutinous air. It sounds like a classic Cage role, not that he allows for the existence of such a thing. Cage is methodical in rebutting preconceived notions about himself. Or what they would call over-the-top performances. Also, his reputation for excess. Even his dress, today, is contradictory, the pastel polo shirt at odds with the tattoos and big jewellery – part country club, part rocker. It is also safe to say that his talent for grotesques is largely what made him. More than one director has threatened to fire Cage for going overboard. In *Crash*, Norman Jewison told him to quit trying to play Ronny, in *Moonstruck*, with art house surrealism. We had a lot of laughs together. That was a different time in my life. Cage once owned a portfolio including castles in Germany and England, mansions in New Orleans and Rhode Island, and an island in the Bahamas. From the outside, it looks as though he went through a period of testosterone-fuelled property acquisition. I thought it was real. I believed in real estate. And I enjoy it that way. The magic of the green hills and the trees and the history. Which is a different kind of magic. My wife loves it and we have good friends there. And I want to keep it that way. But in film acting, for some reason you get criticised for working. Acting to me implies lying. He adds, "And we did it because we loved each other. Hats off to any country that works as hard as they do. Has he shown *Kal Nosferatu* yet? Cage grew up watching James Bond and realised, studying Sean Connery, that a career in action will keep you working. I did not want to be in a big splashy romantic comedy with Cher. It has become an electromagnetic movie! And so I love it. He has a libertarian edge, but also seems broadly liberal. I believe in freedom of speech. I know some people look down on my quietude, but I feel it would impact my ability to be an artist. I know this is random, but the whole reason Claudius survived and went on to be emperor is because he was smart enough to keep quiet and to build his path. His new film, *The Frozen Ground*, based on the true story of a serial killer who killed at least 17 women in Alaska in the 1950s, is a good, solid drama, with Cage as the cop and John Cusack as the killer. They want to please, they want to work. I read the Guardian. Those become resources for me.
