Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned Every person needs forgiveness and salvation that only comes from the Savior, Jesus Christ. The news of judgment is good news for some, but bad news for others. Believers will be ushered into an eternity with God. There they will experience the kind of relationship that was only hinted at while here on earth. No heartache, no tears, the kind of existence for which we were created cf. Eternal punishment, or the second death cf. Unbelievers will persist in a state separated from God. Their spiritual death will continue beyond the grave, except there will be no opportunity for repentance or salvation. The time for the unbeliever to turn to God is now. No one is guaranteed a next breath. One day it will be too late. Sin is the cause of both physical and spiritual death. The good news is that Jesus has overcome both of them. The moment we are saved, we receive spiritual life as we are forgiven of our sins and empowered to live a holy life. In addition, the hope of the future bodily resurrection promises us physical life once again, in a new body that will never die, at the end of this age. After Their Physical Death, Believers Gain Eternal Life John Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.

What does the Bible say? There is something in the mind of man that believes, or wants to believe, that there is more to the story of life than our current experience. We are born; we breathe; our hearts pump blood through our bodies; we are conscious; we think; we live for a while—and then we die. We stop breathing; our hearts stop pumping; our thoughts perish. In recent centuries, the philosophy of materialism and the theory of evolution have gained prominence. According to this school of thought, our material existence based on the chemistry of physical life is indeed all there is. The late Carl Sagan, one famous proponent of materialism, summarized it this way: The life we experience is an accident, with no supreme purpose; and it ends with finality. But in many millions of human hearts, the question persists: Was there anything before this present, conscious existence? Is there anything after it? So, throughout human history, the majority of people have turned to some sort of religion for the answers. What does religion say? The teachings of the various sects of Jainism, Hinduism, Buddhism and other religious systems vary in detail, but include some form of reincarnation also known as the transmigration of souls or metempsychosis. Even some who profess Christianity believe in reincarnation. Some believe that this entire system is depicted in a great mandala—a circle enclosing a square that represents the universe. The ultimate purpose is to become good enough so you can be released from the cycle of life-death-reincarnation-suffering into some sort of state of freedom from fear, pain, ignorance and death. The Bible has much to say about life after death. It is very good news! And it is quite different from religions that feature reincarnation. Depending on the system, this final release can take eons of time, many lives, great desire to be released from the cycle and great suffering along the way. Is Reincarnation in the Bible? This good news centers on the will and purpose of one true God, who has determined through His Son, Jesus Christ, to create an eternal, spiritual family Romans 8: The Bible reveals that existence is not an endless cycle of life and death and reincarnation to another form of life. The Bible reveals one cycle: The first man, Adam, had not previously existed as a conscious being—not a plant, animal or spirit. Note what God told Adam following his sin: Contrary to the religious systems described earlier, the Bible reveals that human beings are mortal, subject to death, not reincarnation. What Is a Soul? There is great purpose to this life! In Scripture God reveals His transcendent purpose for human life. Ultimately, we are to be children of God the Father and brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ, living in harmony and righteousness with God forever! The working out of this purpose begins with the physical, conscious existence of human beings in this life and ends with the spiritual likeness and image of the Creator. Consider what the Bible reveals about this wonderful truth. And ultimately God can grant us the gift of eternal life: So when this corruptible has put on incorruption, and this mortal has put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written: O death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory? What should we do? Think about what you are reading. Pray that God will help you understand it and believe it, for it is based on the one source of believable truth—the Holy Bible, the Word of God. What Jesus revealed about life after death. Although there are theologians and religious authorities who write or speak at great length about life after death, the Bible actually has comparatively little to say on the subject.

Death is a constant reminder that something is terribly wrong with the world. Our frustration with death comes not only from the miserable pain it brings, but also from the fact that death and the afterlife are such mysteries. The afterlife evades our test tubes and refuses to subject itself to our experimentation. Everyone must experience the transition from life to death without the benefit of knowing exactly what that transition looks and feels like. Yet it is this element of the unknown that has made death and the afterlife constant subjects of both obsession and fear. The launching of EosTV is the most recent evidence of our inability to stop obsessing over death. Every worldview whether religious or irreligious, western or eastern has something to say about life after death. Yet somehow many of us still feel unsure about what to say to the grieving couple who just lost their only child or to the wife who just lost her husband of fifty-six years. According to the Bible, death is an aberration in the world, the chief evidence that something is terribly awry. Death is the consequence of our sin, a poison that permeates our world like a vicious cancer. Tolkien makes everything sad come untrue. It means there is hope for life after death. Contrary to popular belief and the beginning of many funny jokes, Saint Peter will not be standing guard at the pearly gates deciding whether our goodies outweigh our baddies. Those who hope in Christ share in his life and immortality. Those who trust in Christ share in his victory over death. Christ has broken the chains of death and gives eternal life to all who place their faith in him. Life in Heaven According to the Bible, those who hope in Christ are immediately with Christ in heaven when they die. The Bible tells us everything we need to know to be eager for heaven but not necessarily everything we want to know. What will heaven be like? Will I know my family? Will my spouse and I still love one another? Will I see my dog again? Will there be golf? Many people cannot imagine heaven as anything other than the caricatured portrait of thousands upon thousands of men and women sitting on clouds, playing the harp, and in my opinion enduring the perpetual boredom of a placid, harp-infested eternity. Scripture regularly refers to heaven as paradise. These relationships will be without any modicum of bitterness, resentment, or disappointment. According to Paul, ultimately heaven is not great because the clouds are soft, the food is good, and the golf is fun though the streets are made of gold. However, when the Bible talks about the final destiny of Christians, it rarely talks about heaven. Instead it focuses on something even better: Perhaps a little clarification is in order. Those in heaven await the return of Christ, the resurrection of their bodies, and the redemption of their whole person: At that time, the souls and the redeemed bodies of believers will reunite. As Paul states, our perishable bodies will become imperishable and our mortal bodies will be clothed with immortality. Jesus came to actually fix the ship. When the Bible talks about resurrection it is describing something entirely different than mere resuscitation. Paul explains this most fully in 1 Corinthians 15; I recommend checking out the whole chapter. The gist is this: The Christian hope of future resurrection is rooted in what Jesus accomplished for us in his own resurrection. To say that the resurrection of bodies is impossible is to say that even Christ was not resurrected. Therefore just as Jesus rose again from the dead with a very real yet perfect, imperishable body, so also will Christians rise from the dead with perfect, imperishable bodies at the second coming of Jesus. The Bible also indicates that God will renew, repair, and restore this world. The dead are not raised just to inhabit the same old fallen, decaying cosmos. He will extricate the poison of death and decay from every square inch of the cosmos. Christ and his people will live in new bodies in a glorious new creation. Not only will death itself be defeated, but its effects will be entirely undone. On the Day of the Lord the day that God makes

everything right, the day that everything sad comes untrue” on that day the same thing will happen to your own hurts and sadness. You will find that the worst things that have ever happened to you will in the end only enhance your eternal delight. On that day, all of it will be turned inside out and you will know joy beyond the walls of the world. The joy of your glory will be that much greater for every scar you bear. By now you might be thinking, Heaven seems great, and a perfect life with no death sounds even better. But what about hell? Does the Bible really describe a place of fire and brimstone, of eternal suffering? Would a loving God really send someone to hell? What is hell all about anyway? Whether we like it or not, the Bible talks about hell. In fact, no one in the Bible talks about hell more than Jesus. In fact, even Christians have disagreed about the nature of hell. For example, one popular notion of hell held in some Christian communities is referred to as annihilationism. Annihilationism asserts that those who die without a saving faith in Christ cease to exist. For example, some annihilationists believe that God would not punish a temporal sin for eternity because the disparity between the offense and the punishment would be unjust. These are just some of the many arguments Christians have used in favor of annihilationism. A detailed analysis of each passage goes beyond the limits of this article. The Bible never portrays God as a petulant, irritable deity who casts people into hell on a whim. Hell exists because God is irrevocably opposed to wickedness. Second, hell is a place of just judgment. Hell exists so that true evil is punished justly. Once again Jesus himself asserts this more forcefully than anyone else in the Bible. The Bible uses many different images to describe the unpleasantness of hell: Whether or not these descriptions are literal is ultimately irrelevant. Whatever the details of hell may be, it is the place where God exercises his just judgment against sin. Regretfully, many people assume that if hell is real then God is not loving. One unfortunate caricature of hell depicts God as an uptight ogre who flies off the handle and casts people into eternal torment when they displease him. Worse yet is the notion that if hell is real then God must be sadistic, a tyrant who delights in inflicting pain on helpless creatures. While these descriptions may characterize pagan deities of the ancient world, nothing could be further from the biblical portrait of God—the God who goes to every length possible to rescue his creation from sin and death. One of the most important things to remember is that hell exists because, like us, God loves justice. Nobody likes to see true villains get away with real evil. Our hearts ache when malicious, life-destroying rapists are not held accountable for their actions. Our souls wince when we helplessly watch wicked institutions oppress the poor for the sake of the rich. We hurt when people are mistreated, abused, and taken advantage of. Why do we yearn for justice when we hear of someone opening fire on a room filled with elementary-school children? Or when we remember the atrocities of the Holocaust? On some level, every human being longs for justice and knows it is good. We cannot bear the thought that the world is so unfair. Nothing is more disturbing than the notion that both oppressed and oppressor, perpetrator and victim will meet the same end. The human heart craves justice because it recognizes that there are real wrongs in the world that simply must not go unpunished. Hell is the place where God makes wrongs right.

What are the seven deadly sins? There are other instances of people who had been raised from the dead, but unlike those mentioned before in the Bible, Lazarus had been dead for an entire period of four days. What does the Bible say about death? The Bible compares death to sleep more than fifty times. After death we are asleep, we are unconscious; we are not aware of the passing of time or of what is going on around us. That is what death is like as well. Peter on the Day of Pentecost said the same of King David. What does the Bible say about cremation? What happens to your soul when you die? Many Christians think of the soul as an immortal entity within us that goes on living after death. What does the Bible say? God did not put a soul into man. He formed the body from the dust of the ground, and then He breathed His life-giving spirit into the lifeless body—and the result was a soul, or a living being. When a person dies, the reverse takes place. The breath of life departs from the body, and the soul no longer exists. At the resurrection, God reunites the body and His life-giving spirit—and the person lives again. If souls existed as separate entities that lived on after we died, that would mean we have immortality. However, the Bible says human beings do not have immortality. Only God is immortal see 1 Timothy 6: If we had immortal souls, why would the righteous seek after something they already have? Is there life after death? We will receive immortality when Jesus comes again see 1 Corinthians The Bible says that all those who have died—both righteous and wicked—will be raised to life in one of two resurrections. According to this verse, the righteous do not go to heaven when they die. They remain asleep in the grave until Jesus returns and raises them to immortal life see 1 Corinthians The wicked are raised to life in a separate resurrection—the resurrection of condemnation. The prophets never mention in the Bible that the righteous immediately go to heaven or the wicked go to hell when they die. Neither did Jesus and His apostles teach it. When Jesus was about to leave His disciples, He did not tell them they would soon come to Him. I go to prepare a place for you. When He returns, our loved ones asleep in Christ will awake from their tombs. No matter how long the time has passed, be it long or short, will seem but a moment to them. By the voice of Jesus, they are called forth from their deep slumber they will begin to think just where they ceased, awakening to a glorious immortality. O Hades, where is your victory?

These deluded people will suffer eternal torment in hell with the devil and his demons, forever separated from God and His goodness. Yet the troublesome question still remainsâ€”why must we die in the first place? The truth is, God never made us to die. It is the result of sin. When Adam and Eve committed the first sin disobedience to God , sin entered into this world; as a result of it, every single one of us will face death at sometime. When we die, we will also face judgment before God. The Bible speaks of death as an enemy. All of these have been brought on mankind because of sin and a fallen race. Death is an evil that produces torment, fear, hatred, suffering, agony, pain, grief and heartache. There is only one way that we can overcome both death and the fear of it; that is through the One who conquered death and the grave. This is the death Jesus is referring to in the above verse, and it is ultimately the death that He came to deliver us from. This death is eternal separation from God. It extends beyond our mortal bodies. It does not mean ceasing to exist, rather it means that we will exist forever in our sinful state. Though hell is a literal place of torment, the main source of its torment is the eternal separation from God. This is far more ghastly than anything we can imagine, just as heaven is more wonderful than anything we can conceive. God never created hell for mankind. It was created as a fiery prison for Satan and the fallen angels demons. Men are going there because they have chosen to follow the devil and have rejected Christ. No one can choose it for us, least of all God. He created man with a free will that He will not violate. To choose the latter will in no uncertain terms lead to the second death. The cross is the greatest symbol of love that was ever shown to this world. It speaks of a perfectly innocent man, who was brutally tortured in the most scandalous of deaths, for a world that spit in His face. We are just as guilty of crucifying our Lord as the people who actually did it because we have sinned and it was for sin He was crucified. We are the ones who chose to sin! Yet, God in His great mercy, made a glorious way out of the inevitable result of our sin for us. God put all of the sins of the whole world upon Him and punished Him in our place. He is the eternal and sinless Holy Spirit. Jesus did not die spiritually. The Scripture in 2 Corinthians 5: However, if that was all that

took place, the story would have a very bitter ring to it indeed. Preaching just the death of Jesus is only half the message. The gospel good news is that Jesus is alive today! Jesus is the only man that ever came back to life from the grave. Every religion in the world outside of Christianity has a grave or tomb where their leader is buried. Only in the Bible is recorded the tomb that was found empty because Christ rose from the dead and is alive today! Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they came unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them. And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulchre. And they entered in, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus. And it came to pass, as they were much perplexed thereabout, behold, two men stood by them in shining garments: And as they were afraid, and bowed down their faces to the earth, they said unto them, Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen: It is the resurrection that makes the Christian religion different from any other religion. For if the dead rise not, then is not Christ raised: And if Christ be not raised, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins. Then they also which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished. If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable. But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept. For since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive. But every man in his own order: Only one has ever been resurrected thus far, Jesus Christ. Because Jesus overcame the grave, this resurrection is now available to every one of His followers. It is not the same thing as being raised from the dead. This is an eternal resurrection. Some people, such as Lazarus John 11 , were raised from the dead but not resurrected as they eventually died again. There have been many documented cases of people dying and coming back to life. Though this is glorious, the resurrection to eternal life with Christ is different; it is the final state of those who have trusted in Christ. I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death. If we are in Christ when our body dies, we will face an existence that will make our time on earth seem pale and shadowy. Some Christians will even escape death if they are alive at the second coming of Jesus to the earth. In that day, those that are alive will receive their glorified bodies right after the dead in Christ are raised and receive theirs. That day is approaching quickly and that is why the Lord is warning all of us to be ready. The hope of the church is the resurrection. Behold, I show you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? What will our glorified bodies look like when we get to heaven? Our glorified bodies will appear different.

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
