

1: PICASSO: His Life and Work by Roland Penrose | Kirkus Reviews

Sir Roland Algernon Penrose CBE (14 October - 23 April) was an English artist, historian and poet. He was a major promoter and collector of modern art and an associate of the surrealists in the United Kingdom.

Early life[edit] Penrose was the son of James Doyle Penrose , [2] a successful portrait painter, and Elizabeth Josephine Peckover, the daughter of Baron Peckover , a wealthy Quaker banker. He was the third of four brothers; his older brother was the medical geneticist Lionel Penrose. Surrealism[edit] Penrose returned to London in and was one of the organisers of the London International Surrealist Exhibition , which led to the establishment of the English surrealist movement. Penrose settled in Hampstead , north London, where he was the centre of the community of avant-garde British artists and emigres who had settled there. He opened the London Gallery on Cork Street , where he promoted the Surrealists as well as the sculptor Henry Moore , to whom he was first introduced by his close friend Wolfgang Paalen , as well as the painter Ben Nicholson , and the sculptors Barbara Hepworth and Naum Gabo. Penrose commissioned a sculpture from Moore for his Hampstead house that became the focus of a press campaign against abstract art. Photographs of their stay can be seen at Falmouth Art Gallery. In the same year he had an affair with Peggy Guggenheim , when she met him at her gallery Guggenheim Jeune to try and sell him a painting by French Surrealist artist Yves Tanguy. Penrose told Guggenheim that he loved an American woman in Egypt and in her autobiography Guggenheim reports she told him to "go to Egypt to get his ladylove. They lived at 21 Downshire Hill, Hampstead, London, which now bears a blue plaque. They met again in London during the war , and Valentine came to live with Roland and Lee Miller for eighteen months. As a Quaker, Penrose had been a pacifist , but after the outbreak of World War II he volunteered as an air raid warden and then taught military camouflage at the Home Guard training centre at Osterley Park. Penrose organised the first two ICA exhibitions: Penrose also designed the landscaping around the house as a setting for works of modern sculpture. In , thieves broke into his London flat, stole a number of works, and then demanded a ransom. The paintings were later recovered as a result of diligent police work. Some were damaged but were restored by the Tate Gallery. Legacy[edit] His bold and enigmatic surrealist paintings, drawings and objects are some of the most enduring images of the movement. He is remembered for his postcard collages, examples of which are found in major national collections across Britain. He was awarded the CBE in , [13] and he was knighted for his services to the visual arts in Penrose is the uncle of the physicist and polymath Sir Roger Penrose. Penrose proposes the characteristics this new physics may have and specifies the requirements for a bridge between classical and quantum mechanics what he calls correct quantum gravity. Penrose believes that such deterministic yet non-algorithmic processes may come into play in the quantum mechanical wave function reduction , and may be harnessed by the brain. He argues that the present computer is unable to have intelligence because it is an algorithmically deterministic system. He argues against the viewpoint that the rational processes of the mind are completely algorithmic and can thus be duplicated by a sufficiently complex computer. This contrasts with supporters of strong artificial intelligence , who contend that thought can be simulated algorithmically. Minsky maintained that "one can carry that quest [for scientific explanation] too far by only seeking new basic principles instead of attacking the real detail. In those works, he also combined his observations with that of anesthesiologist Stuart Hameroff. Penrose and Hameroff have argued that consciousness is the result of quantum gravity effects in microtubules , which they dubbed Orch-OR orchestrated objective reduction. Max Tegmark , in a paper in Physical Review E, [20] calculated that the time scale of neuron firing and excitations in microtubules is slower than the decoherence time by a factor of at least 10,, Smolin , say the calculations confirm what they had suspected all along. To bridge this gap, the group made a series of proposals. They supposed that the interiors of neurons could alternate between liquid and gel states. In the gel state, it was further hypothesized that the water electrical dipoles are oriented in the same direction, along the outer edge of the microtubule tubulin subunits. Each tubulin also has a tail extending out from the microtubules, which is negatively charged, and therefore attracts positively charged ions. It is suggested that this could provide further screening. Further to this, there was a suggestion that the microtubules could be pumped into a coherent state by biochemical energy. Finally, he suggested that the configuration of the microtubule lattice might be suitable for quantum error correction, a means of holding together quantum coherence in the face of environmental interaction. Sometimes, as we know, re-reading gives a depth to the initial reading. It is not that it dwarfs the rest, but rather gives a center to the massiveness of the exhibition, which will only travel, after its magnificent presentation in Edinburgh, to Hamburg and to Amsterdam. I love that with surrealism, everything is always Being Set Up. Fully worth making it over to somewhere it is shown from wherever you are. Second Look Now looking over the press release and recontemplating my visit with a bit more leisure, so much comes to light: The essays by Dawn Ades and Elizabeth Cowling are crucial to any understanding of how this exhibition matters to surrealising readers.
